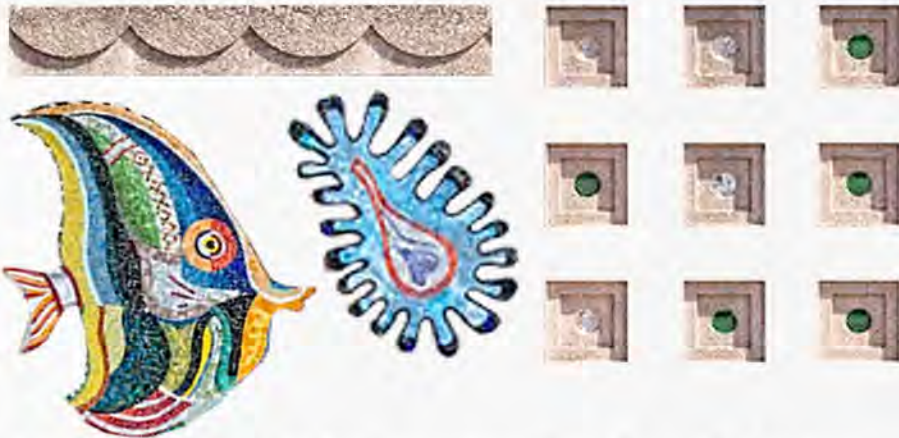

## 1150 GRAND CONCOURSE



The **Art Deco** style of this building is characterized by rounded corners, repeated shapes, and fanciful decorations. Can you find these unique examples of **ornamentation**? Take a peek in the lobby for more Art Deco details.

Located in the **Bronx**, this **residential** building was designed by architects **Horace Ginsbern** and **Marvin Fine** in the **Art Deco** style.

Completed in **1937**, it is also known as The Fish Building, named for its intricate, aquarium-like mural at its entrance.

The original doors of nickel, brass, and steel (pictured to the right) were replaced in 2005.

Use the empty space in the picture below to design a new door for this building. Think about how your design might compliment the building's unique **facade**, or front.

Using the side of a crayon, create a texture rubbing from the building's mosaic in the space above. Can you observe the two materials needed to make a mosaic? The colorful ceramic pieces are called **tesserae**. The space between each piece is filled with **grout**.
