




81st Street – Museum of Natural History Station I Manhattan, NY

This local station, served by the A, B, and C trains, displays mosaics and reliefs depicting extinct, existing, and endangered animals, inspired by the museum's collections.








### Adams Street Library I Brooklyn, NY

Designed by Susan T. Rodriguez, this new addition to Central Park's north end brings people together through recreation, nature and community.








#### Greenest Block in Brooklyn I Brooklyn, NY

This annual contest held by Brooklyn Botanic Garden celebrates neighborhood efforts in beautifying urban spaces with sustainable gardening.






# Archtober October 1–31, 2025

Designed by Heatherwick Studio with landscape architecture by MNLA, this artificial island off Pier 55 offers a public park and performance space on the Hudson River.







### Louis Armstrong Center I Queens, NY






## Luna Park I Brooklyn, NY

Luna Park in Coney Island is a historic amusement park that opened in 2010, offering rides, games, and family-friendly seaside attractions.








## The Metropolitan Museum of Art I Manhattan, NY

On view at The Met, The Temple of Dendur is a 43-feet-long structure made of local Nubian sandstone, dating back to the Ptolemaic and Roman Periods of early Egyptian architecture.
